Workshop Description: How well do you fulfill Virginia's Standards of Learning (SOLs) as you teach ASL? Do you know how the state expects you to teach your ASL classes? How familiar are you with these SOLs and the national foreign language standards on which they are based? This workshop answers these questions in depth by examining Virginia's SOLs and ACTFL's 5 Cs and how they apply to the teaching of American Sign Language. Goals of this training include the following:

1. To understand each of the 5 Cs and the Standards of Learning (SOLs)
2. To understand how the 5 Cs and SOLs influence ASL teaching
3. To identify the standards in the curriculum you use and how to modify instruction to meet all standards
4. To design lessons that fulfill state and national standards
5. To design assessments that fulfill state and national standards

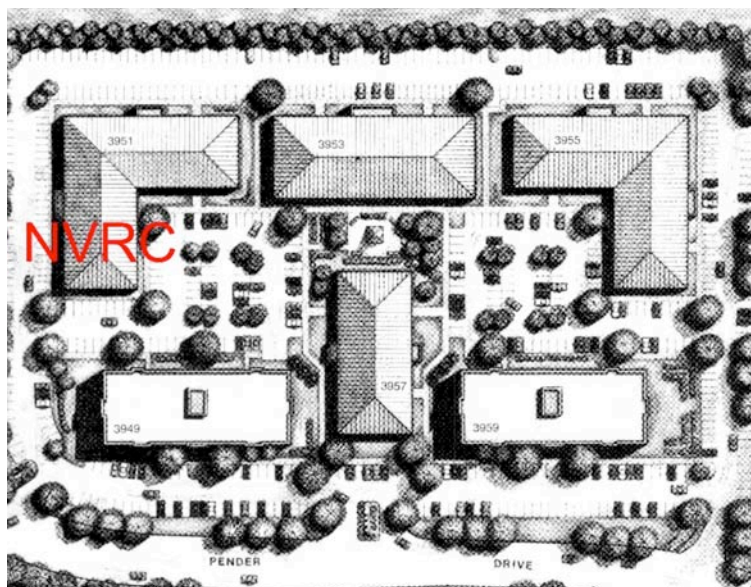
1. Overview of the Master ASL! series

He is a frequent presenter on topics related to ASL teaching and assessment at both the high school and university levels, serves as a language learning consultant, and conducts weekend courses for foreign/second-language instructors at the University of California, Santa Cruz. He teaches high school and university-level ASL courses in California, and also teaches at the Center for ASL Literacy at Gallaudet University during the summer sessions. FROM I-66: Take exit 57A (US 50-E) toward Fairfax. Merge onto Route 50 East, also known as Lee Jackson Memorial Highway. Turn LEFT onto Waples Mill Road. Turn RIGHT at light onto Pender Drive. Look on right for Fairfax Executive Park. Turn RIGHT at third entrance (left corner of Building 3949, a 3-story building). Drive toward back of complex and turn RIGHT between the 3-story building and the 1-story Building, which is 3951 Pender. Parking is in the courtyard. NVRC faces the courtyard, Suite 130. There are two entrances; one side door directly into the office (sign on door) and one facing the courtyard leading into the meeting rooms (Sign on building). Handicap accessible parking spaces with ramp are near the entrance to the meeting rooms
