Dr. Michael Kemp was best known for his sense of humor and his teaching style. He taught ASL for 35 years, the last 31 at Gallaudet University. During his 31 years at Gallaudet, Dr. Kemp served as chair of three different academic departments, and served on numerous academic and professional committees. He focused his efforts on teaching and consulting Visual Gestural Communications throughout the world. His goal was to bridge the communication gap between the national and international deaf and hearing communities.

William "Bill" Thomas Ennis Jr. died on June 2, 2009, after a two-year battle with cancer. He was a federal employee for 38 years, but was fondly remembered as a storyteller, teacher, comedian, basketball lover and avid golfer. As a teacher, Ennis taught ASL for 30 years. He was also a signmaster for several theaters in the Washington, DC area. His greatest legacy was his storytelling. He became famous for this personification of a "golf ball" and audiences loved the "St. Valentine's Day Massacre." His love of life set the tone for family gatherings.

Annual General Meeting

On May 18, 2009, the annual General Meeting started with a presentation by Lenny Granda on “Using Technology to Teach ASL.”

The Promethean ActivBoard is a new technology making a bold appearance in many classrooms especially in Loudoun County, VA where ever classroom has replaced the traditional chalk board. The Promethean ActivBoard is an all in one media console to show DVDs, pictures and connect to a computer for internet use. This board can be easily converted to a white board with a smart pen and an additional remote mini-screen to write on from anywhere in the room. Another feature of the board is the ability to test the students with an egg sized remote for each student. The teacher can ask a question and each student can select their answer on their individual remote; this is like taking a multiple choice test with

answers from a-f. The results will appear on the screen in a graph format with how many students answered per multiple choice option. The right answer will appear in green and the wrong answers will appear in red.

This technology allows teachers to present the material visually and keeps the students engaged. The Promethean ActivBoard can be used for any lesson. To teach a common ASL 1 lesson such as types of clothing, colors, designs, and other describing information the teacher can illustrate many types of clothing on the screen and quickly switch the clothing, color and design by a simple click and drag of the object. The teacher can switch to a note pad application to type notes and highlight important points and draw free hand. To allow the students to become engaged with describing a picture or a situation this board brings it to the next level by allowing the teacher to focus on one small area of the picture with the rest of the screen black. The students can describe what they see then the teacher can uncover more of the picture slowly as the students describe more and more until the picture is fully revealed. What looks like a funny facial expression on a person's face can turn into a long story of what is actually happening in the surrounding scene by the end of the exercise. This board promotes a positive and interactive way to study for tests with game shows like “Who Wants to be a Millionaire” to test the students knowledge of facts and history. With Google Maps and other high tech web applications at a click of a button the sky is the limit for ways to incorporate this technology into your classroom.
